PUBLIC SAFETY AND TRAFFIC CONTROL



Flaggers should be alert with a watchful eye at all times.



Proper signal flagging can reduce risks associated with vehicular and pedestrian traffic near a work site. These risks include pedestrians tripping, pedestrians entering drop zones, vehicles colliding, and workers being struck by motor vehicles.



Workers should know how to provide a safe path for traffic and pedestrians.



Workers should know how to control traffic and set up a safety zone.



When controlling traffic, workers should give positive, clear directions to road users through the use of appropriate devices. Vehicular traffic flow should be inhibited as little as possible, and pedestrians should have a safe, convenient and accessible path.

MONDAY

DRIVE SAFETY TIP

<u>Use Turn Signals</u>

Failing to signal your intentions to other motorists is always dangerous -- as well as discourteous. Other motorists are not psychic; they can't guess that you are planning on making a right turn - or about to move into the next lane.
