DAILY SAFETY NUGGETS

MONDAY

What procedures shall be followed if a fire begins that cannot be extinguished or contained? The fire department shall be notified, and all personnel and equipment shall be moved to a location out of the path of the fire

TUESDAY

What specific personal action shall be avoided when handling or working near flammable liquids? Smoking.

WEDNESDAY

When should you change clothing that is contaminated by flammable liquids? As soon as possible.

THURSDAY

TRUE/FALSE: Every truck shall be equipped with a properly mounted and charged fire extinguisher. TRUE

FRIDAY

TRUE/FALSE: It is permissible to fuel some equipment when it is running as long as it is performed carefully. FALSE - Never fuel equipment when it is running, no matter how hard it is to start.

SATURDAY

What should you do with a fire extinguisher after you use it? After using a fire extinguisher, you should turn it in to your supervisor for replacement. Never keep a partially discharged fire extinguisher on your truck.

DRIVE SAFETY TIP

Avoid Distractions

We all know not to use cell phones while driving, but it isn't just cell phones that cause distractions. Eating, applying makeup, fiddling with electronic devices or interacting with passengers also diverts a driver's attention in potentially deadly ways. Perhaps the best advice on driving distractions came from rocker Jim Morrison: "Keep your eyes on the road, your hands upon the wheel."
